

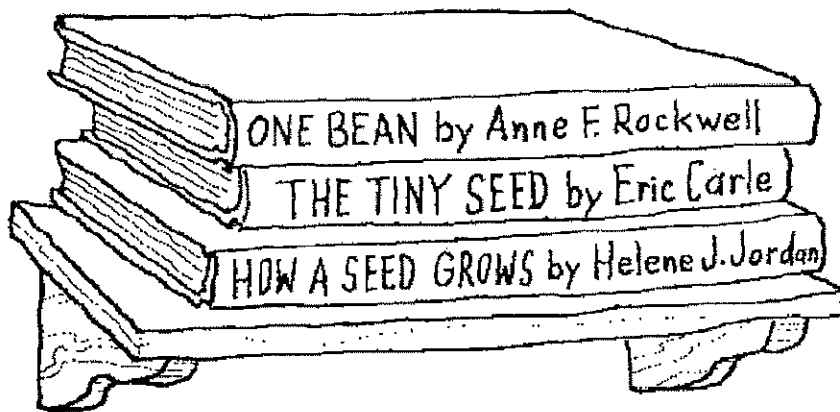

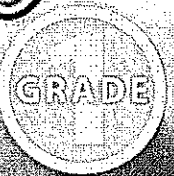

Earth is a planet. We live on Earth. Landforms and bodies of water are on Earth.

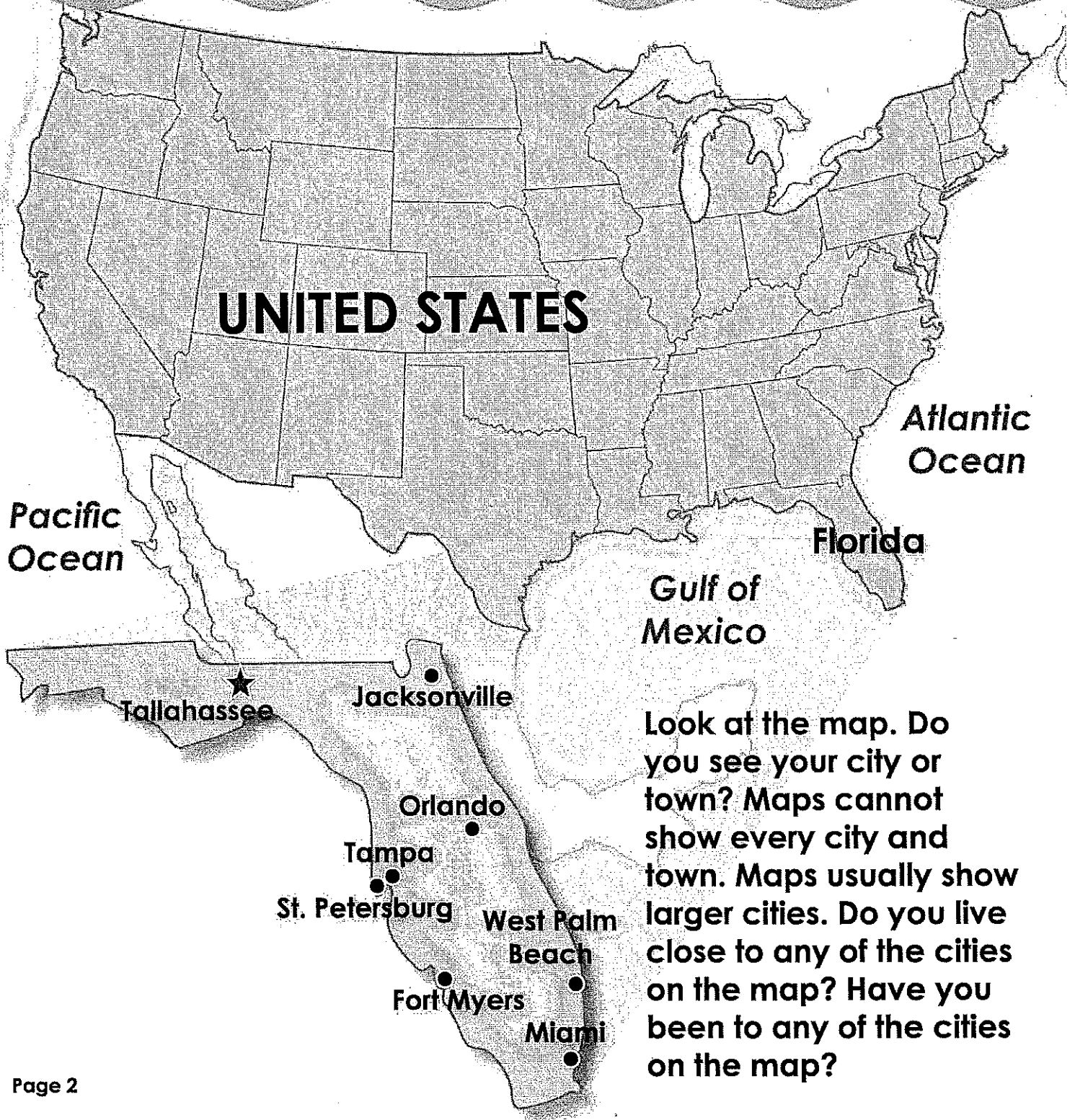
Do you see North America on the globe? North America is a continent. A continent is a large area of land.



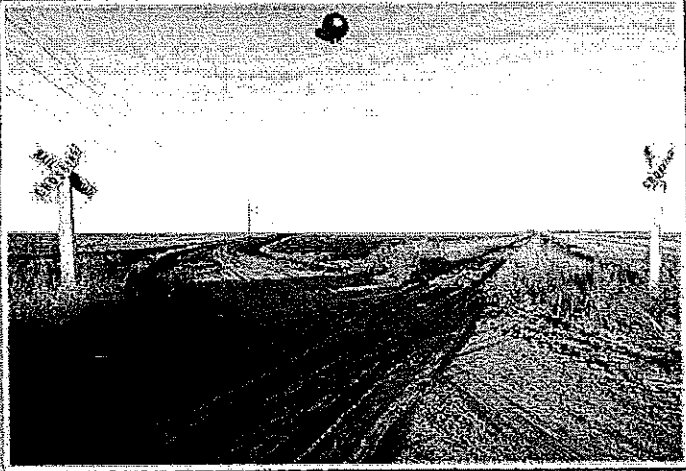

Earth

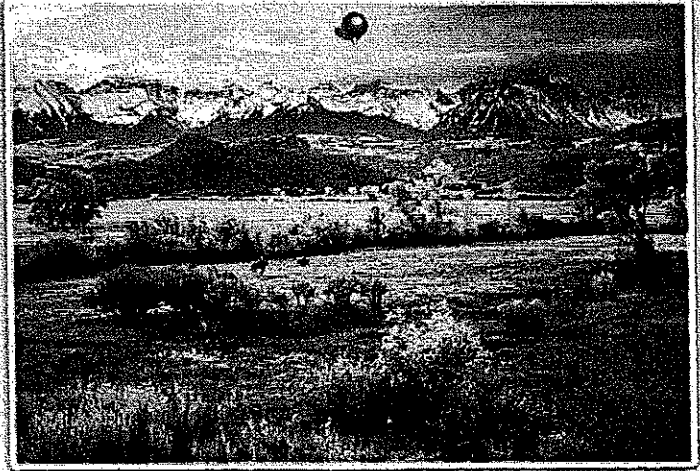
Look at the map. Do you see Florida? What large bodies of water are next to Florida?

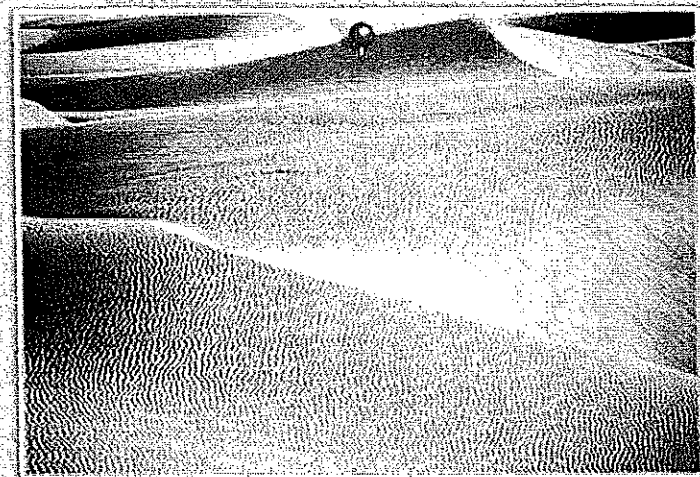
The middle part of the United States is sometimes called the Plains. The land there is mostly flat.



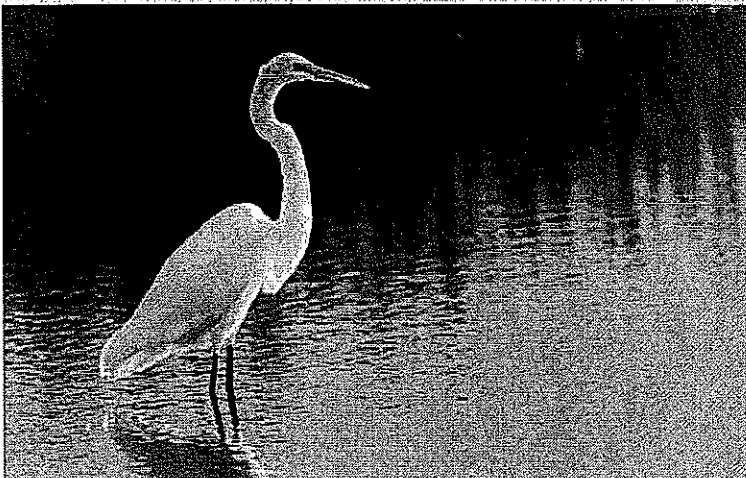
In the West, the Rocky Mountains can be seen from miles away.

But in deserts, like the Sahara Desert of Africa, there is almost no water at all.

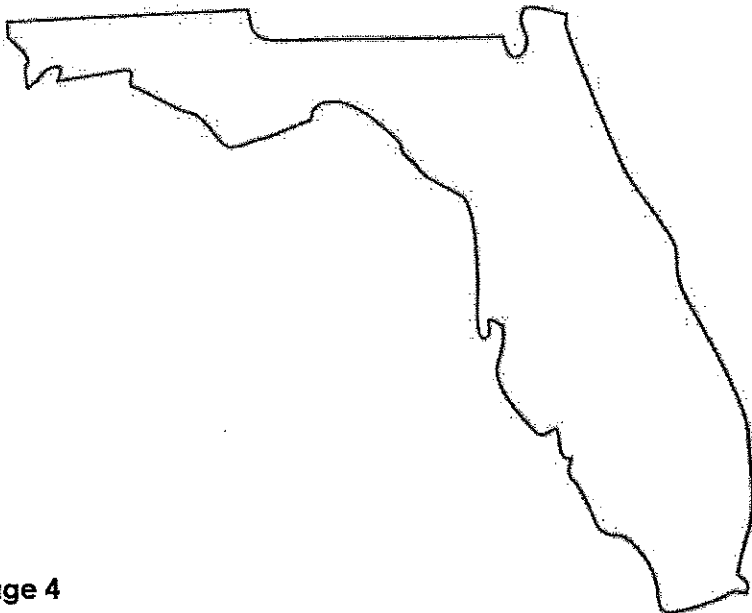

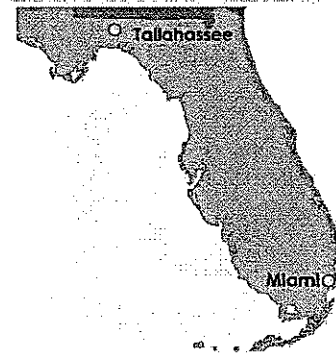
