

Two weeks before Christmas, the ants gave Lazy Legs Grasshopper a job! Ants know how to be kind. Ants know how to work hard!


Lazy Legs upset the ants last summer. He told them to chill out. He said they should enjoy life more. He sang a rude song about them.


Gary Goat Beats Fred Fox in Court!

"I am so happy," said Gary.


"Fred played a mean trick on me. I was stuck down in that well for days. Now, he has to pay!"
